

INSIDE THE LIBRARY

SMARTDesk

- Check out materials including laptops, create a PaperCut account, have your device tagged by ITS, ask a reference question.
- To meet with ITS staff, appointments are required. Schedule an appointment at <http://wcmc.simplybook.me>

Computers and Wireless

- Desktops - Both Mac and PC computers are available to users. All computers are fully networked and have Microsoft Office suite, Adobe, and EndNote. All computers print to the library's laser printers.
- Wireless networks - ITS tagged laptops use WCMC. For limited guest access, use WCMCGuest.
- Laptop checkout - Check out a laptop from the SMARTDesk for 3-hour use inside or outside the Library.

Printing, Photocopying & Scanning (PaperCut)

- The printers/copiers are operated by using a PaperCut account. You can create an account at the SMARTDesk.
- Black and White - 10 cents per page; Color - 50 cents per page; Scanning to email is free.

SERVICES

InterLibrary Loan (ILL)

- If we do not own a book or journal article, ILL will obtain it free of charge from another library. Requests usually arrive within 3 business days.

Grant Editing

- The Library offers a free editing service for Weill Cornell grant applicants.
- The service is designed to review the language, not the science, of your grant application.

eCommons: Weill Cornell's Institutional Repository

- A free, open access platform, available to the WCM & NYP community.
- Increasing visibility via eCommons will facilitate discovery (Google Scholar), leading to higher citation counts. Persistent links ensure a stable online location (URL) for your work, allowing you link to your work & ensuring reliable access to your work over time.

Library Bioinformatics Service

- Gain insight into the purposes and applications of bioinformatics techniques, software, and databases.

Systematic Review Service

- Collaboration may include: helping to define a research question; assisting in developing and registering the protocol; targeting specific database; conducting literature searches; access to Covidence, a systematic review tool.

Notary Public Service

Myra Mahon Patient Resource Center

- A professional medical librarian, trained library assistants and volunteers are on staff at to help connect patients, family members, caregivers, and prospective patients to quality health information resources.

- Established in 1972, the Archives collect, organize and preserve the records of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital and Weill Cornell Medicine, as well as affiliated and predecessor institutions, and make these materials available for use by students, faculty, staff and the public.

- Access full text articles, chapters, e-books, and our physical collection
- Access all WCM content, as well as RU and MSKCC physical offerings
- Manage your library account, renewals, and requests in one, easy to navigate location

Popular eResources

- **PubMed** - Access to millions of citations and abstracts covering fields of biomedicine and health.
- **UpToDate** - An online resource designed to answer clinical questions that arise in daily practice. Covers symptoms, diagnosis, treatment and more options for thousands of conditions.
- **Scopus** - The largest abstract and citation database of peer-reviewed literature, including scientific journals, books and conference proceedings, covering research topics across all scientific and technical disciplines, ranging from medicine and social sciences to arts and humanities.
- **Micromedex** - One of the largest online reference databases about drug information, toxicology, diseases, acute care and alternative medicine. Drug dosing and medication management for all FDA-approved medications and select drugs approved by EMA and Health Canada.
- **PsycINFO** - Covers literature in psychology and related behavioral and social sciences, including psychiatry and sociology. This database includes journals, books, reviews, and dissertations.
- **OVID** - a suite of biomedical databases including EMBASE, MEDLINE, and HAPI.
- **ClinicalKey** - Supports healthcare professionals and students with the latest evidence across specialties in a variety of formats, including full-text reference books and journals, point-of-care monographs, drug information, videos, practice guidelines, customized patient education handouts and more.
- **Cochrane Library** - A collection of databases that contain different types of high-quality, independent evidence to inform healthcare decision-making. At its core is the collection of Cochrane Reviews, a database of systematic reviews and meta-analyses which summarize and interpret the results of medical research.

- Must have an ITS tagged device

SciWheel is a browser-based platform where Weill Cornell affiliates can collect, manage, cite, write, and discuss scientific literature privately and via shared projects with peers. It is available for download from the library's e-Resources tab (must be done for the first time inside the WCMC network).
